Her journey is rooted in serving people, in which her principles and work are both aligned. As a college graduate, Juliet began her career in management with Wachovia Bank, fast-tracking to bank officer. Feeling self-empowered, and building on her initial success, she pursued an intentional search for a leadership opportunity at an organization that shares her own mindset of excellence around principles, people and products. She would land at Chick-fil-A, Inc.

Selected by Chick-fil-A, Inc., one of America's most admired brands, Juliet blossomed in an environment where she was only the third black female business consultant for Chick-fil-A franchised multi-million dollar businesses, then built and led the Chick-fil-A Home Office Backstage Tour, and later became a Chick-fil-A community ambassador. After 17 years of corporate management experience in operations, marketing and community affairs with Chick-fil-A, Juliet left the corporate world in 2016 to build her own platform, **OWN YOUR OPPORTUNITIES™ (#OYO)**, an inspiration-to-action speaking and training platform that promotes *knowing* your value, *investing* in your value and *sharing* your value. Her passion for inspiring others to self-discovery is undeniable.

Juliet has received significant awards and recognition for her real-world business insights. She was recently selected into the Women of Excellence Class of 2018 by the *Atlanta Tribune* and *Atlanta Daily World*.
